

#### DEFINITIONS

The 4 agreements, 6 conditions and Compass were created as a navigation tool to help guide us through conversations about race. It helps us know where we are personally, as well as to recognize the direction from which others come. According to the compass, there are 4 ways that people deal with racial information, events or issues: FEELING - There is a response to information through feeling - anger, sadness, joy. THINKING - There is a personal disconnect or search for more information. BELIEVING - There is a deep-seeded belief that relates to the racial information. ACTING - There is a need to respond to information by doing.
