Dear First Grade Families,

We are off to a terrific start in first grade and your students are doing great! We have been practicing the routines and procedures for first grade and also learning about rules during our Social Studies time. We've talked about why we have rules, who uses rules, and why rules are important. We also discussed chores and the importance of being responsible. In math we have been practicing addition and subtracting and learning about data and graphing. We've reviewed letters, sounds, CVC words, and kindergarten tricky words in Reading. This week we'll begin learning new spelling patterns and reading our first set of stories.

**Library:** Students will go to Library every Thursday morning. Please remember to return books to school so that new books can be checked out.
