1	The district encourages community partnerships that strengthen and enhance
2	school programs and create a climate of participation and cooperation between
3	community organizations, private citizens, and the district's schools.

- The district is committed to protecting students, parents, teachers, and school administrators from over-commercialization and fundraising efforts that are exploitative, coercive, disruptive to the educational process, threatening to the health and welfare of students, or lacking in educational merit.
- The district will manage, restrict, or decline funds, gifts, or fundraising activities to assure that fundraising and expenditures comply with applicable district, state, and federal law and guidelines, including, but not limited to, Title IX and Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) rules and regulations.

12 <u>General Fundraising Standards</u>

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- Fundraisers must be pre-approved by building administrators, the superintendent, or the superintendent's designee. The following general fundraising standards shall be followed to ensure equity and safety of students and faculty:
 - Faculty and student participation in fundraising shall be strictly voluntary.
- Participation in fundraising may not impact a student's grade.
- Students shall not be required to participate in fundraising activities as a

 condition for belonging to a team, club, or group; nor shall a student's

 fundraising effort affect his/her participation time or standing on any such

 team, club, or group. Fundraising efforts shall be conducted for the benefit of

 the team, club, or group, as a whole.
 - Direct donation campaigns are encouraged in lieu of direct sales.

DFAB <u>Fundraising</u> DFAB-2

1	•	Competitive enticements for participation are discouraged; however, school
2		principals may approve the awarding of rewards or prizes to groups, classes,
3		or students participating in fundraising activities.

- Schools may not impose sales quotas (or the like) as a part of fundraising efforts, and students shall not be required to pay for any unsold items that are returned to the school.
- 7 Door-to-door sales are prohibited for all students
- Raffles are allowed if performed in compliance with Kansas Department of
 Revenue Lottery Law and district guidelines.
- Online fundraising ("crowdfunding") is allowed only through district-approved
 websites. The business office will review all websites for compliance with State,
 Federal and school laws as well as acceptable accounting procedures. The
 purpose of the fundraiser and the language used to promote it must be pre approved by building administrators, the superintendent, or the
 superintendent's designee.
 - Fundraisers for which a group promotes dining at a local restaurant at a designated time in exchange for a portion of the sale proceeds ("Eat and Earn" or "Dine and Donate" events) are allowed.
- 19 <u>Approval Criteria</u>

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- With proper approval fundraising may be done to enhance:
- Academic programs.
- Travel and associated costs incidental to academic study (including field trips),
 athletic competitions, or performance competitions.
- Sports and other related physical education and recreational programs.

DFAB <u>Fundraising</u> DFAB-3

- The occupational development of students.
- Performance opportunities.
- Facilities and equipment that will enhance student opportunities and programs.

• Humanitarian projects.

Fundraising by District and Schools

Fundraising is permitted within the district to allow the district and schools (student clubs and organizations, sports teams, and individual classes) to raise additional funds to augment academic and co-curricular programs and to engage private citizens and community organizations to enhance the educational opportunities of the district's students.

Fundraising activities must be pre-approved in writing by the principal, superintendent or superintendent's designee and must be supervised by a member of the faculty. Funds collected though fundraising efforts must be deposited in a dedicated account under the direct control of the school or school district. Principals shall not transfer or otherwise expend donated or fundraised funds in a manner contrary to donor restrictions or the fundraising purpose unless the donor(s) authorize(s) a different use.

School and district fundraising activities will be accounted for using established school and district accounting systems and procedures. Records of fundraising efforts, including accurate reporting on participation levels and financial outcomes, shall be open to the parents, students, and donors. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to require or authorize the release of personally identifiable information protected by Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

DFAB Fundraising DFAB-4

1	The district is responsible for reporting all district and school revenues
2	including those that are obtained through fundraising and gifts. State, Federal and
3	district procurement policies must be followed.
4	Fundraising by External Organizations
5	The Lawrence Schools Foundation a community organization, or a recognized
6	parent organization, including but not limited to a booster club, Parent Teacher
7	Association (PTA), or Parent Teacher Organization (PTO), may conduct fundraising
8	activities for the benefit of the district or schools (student clubs and organizations,
9	sports teams and individual classes) within the district.
10	Fundraising activities will not be endorsed or sponsored by the district or its
11	schools without written consent of the principal of the school, superintendent or the
12	superintendent's designee of the district. Materials that advertise community
13	fundraising activities may be placed in the school office or other locations identified
14	by the school principal.
15	The district strongly encourages fundraising done by external organizations to
16	follow the same fundraising guidelines and approval criteria required of the district
17	and its schools.
18	The district, schools, Lawrence Schools Foundation, and recognized parent
19	organization groups may not engage in fundraising that directly or indirectly
20	supplants or supplements any individual employee's compensation by direct or
21	indirect payment, commissions, or payment in kind. Compensation includes but is
22	not limited to cash payments, gift cards and other cash equivalent. Gift cards and
23	cash equivalents are to be avoided in order to not create an adverse tax
24	consequence for employees. This limitation is not intended to preclude the

employee from receiving an award for excellence that is available to all employees

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2	The superintendent or designee shall develop and maintain regulations for the
3	process of fundraising and accepting charitable gifts. Such regulations shall include
4	principles of accountability, record keeping, and appropriate protocols for
5	safeguarding raised funds, protecting confidential information, and proper use of tax
