### Background:

The Board of Education's policy committee has met to discuss three policies that are being recommended for amendment.

Policies Recommended for Amendment:

### **EBC Security and Safety**

The committee is recommending grammatical changes, addition of language that ensures the reporting requirements do not violate the terms of the memorandum of understanding with local law enforcement the district will enter into effective July 1, 2017 in compliance with Kansas law. The policy is also being modified to allow the superintendent to designate a person to receive building reports.

#### **JCDBB** Weapons

The committee has modified this policy by broadening the definition of the term "weapon" to include a "destructive device." There are technical changes regarding agencies to whom reports are filed. Finally, there is recommended language implementing the new legal requirements allowing air guns on school property.

#### JDDB Reporting to Law Enforcement

This policy is being amended to include the provision that any necessary reporting shall not violate the terms of the memorandum of understanding with local law enforcement the district will enter into effective July 1, 2017 in compliance with Kansas law.

## Recommendation:

The Board Policy Committee recommends the review of the referenced polices. Once the review is complete and any suggested changes are considered, the committee will submit the final recommendations for amendment at the November 14, 2016 board meeting.

#### Motion:

"I move the Board of Education approve the review of the referenced policies for possible amendment and adoption at its November 14, 2016 meeting."

- Security devices may be installed at district attendance centers. Other
  measures may be taken to prevent trespassing on school grounds and intrusions
  or disturbances from occurring in school buildings. The district shall cooperate
  with law enforcement in security matters and shall, as required by law and by
- 5 this policy, report felonies and misdemeanors committed at school, on school
- 6 property or at school-sponsored activities.

### 7 <u>Security Services</u>

# 10 Reporting Crimes at School to Law Enforcement

- Unless reporting would violate the terms of any memorandum of

  understanding between the district and local law enforcement, Any any district

  employee who knows or has reason to believe any of the following has occurred

  at school; on school property; or at a school-sponsored activity, program or

  event shall immediately report this information to local law enforcement:
- 16 Reportable acts shall include:
- an any act which may constitute the commission of a felony or a misdemeanor:
- 19 an any act which involves the possession, use, or disposal of explosives,
- 20 firearms, or other weapons as defined in current law.
- 21 The district employee shall notify the building administrator that a
- 22 report has been made. It is recommended that the building administrator also
- 23 be notified.

Reporting Certain Students to Administrators and Staff

6 identifiable information about students. These reports and this policy may be

7 made available upon request to parents, patrons, students, employees, and

8 others who request this information.

# JCDBB Weapons (see JCDBBC, JDD, JDDB, EBC, KGD and KGE) JCDBB

- 1 A student shall not possess a weapon and/or destructive device at
- 2 school, on school property or at a school supervised event.
- 3 <u>Definition of a Weapon (K.S.A. 72-89a01)</u>
- As used in this policy, the term "weapon" and/or "destructive device" means shall include, but not be limited to:
- any object which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to
   expel a projectile by the action of an explosive;
- the frame or receiver of any object described in the preceding example;
- 9 any firearm muffler or firearm silencer;
- any explosive, incendiary or poison gas:
- o bomb.
- o grenade,
- o rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces,
- o missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than 1/4 ounce.
- o mine or
- o similar device;
- any object which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than 1/2 inch in diameter;
- any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting
   any device into a destructive device described in the two immediately
   preceding examples, and from which a destructive device may be readily
   assembled;
- any bludgeon, sand club, metal knuckles or throwing star;
- any knife, commonly referred to as a switchblade, which has a blade that opens automatically by hand pressure applied to a button, spring or other device in the handle of the knife, or any knife having a blade that opens or falls or is ejected into position by the force of gravity or by an outward, downward or centrifugal thrust or movement.

- any electronic device designed to discharge immobilizing levels of
   electricity, commonly known as a stun gun.
- As used in this policy, the term "weapon" shall not include:
- 4 an antique firearm
- 5 any device which is neither designed nor redesigned for use as a weapon
- any device, although originally designed for use as a weapon, which is redesigned for use as a signaling, pyrotechnic, line throwing, safety, or similar device,
- surplus ordinance sold, loaned or given by the secretary of the army
   pursuant to the provisions of section 4684(2), 4685 or 4686 of title 10 of
   the United States code [federal law] or
- class C common fireworks.

#### Penalties for Possession

- Possession of a weapon and/or destructive device shall result in expulsion from school for a period of not less than one calendar year, except that the superintendent may recommend this expulsion requirement be modified on a case-by-case basis. (see JDC). Expulsion hearings for possession of a weapon and/or destructive device shall be conducted by the superintendent.
- A student determined to be in possession of a weapon and/or

  destructive device at school, on school property or at a school supervised

  activity shall be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency(ies), and

  if a juvenile, to DCF or the Commissioner of Juvenile Justice. the Secretary

  for DCF or the Secretary of KDOC as appropriate.
- 25 Possession of an air gun at school, on school property, or at a 26 school supervised activity is prohibited except for the time during which

- 1 students are participating in an air gun related activity sponsored by an
- 2 organization held at school or when in transit to or from such activities.
- 3 ''Air gun'' means any device which will or is designed to or may be readily
- 4 converted to, expel a projectile by the release of compressed air or gas, and
- 5 which is of 0.18 caliber or less and has a muzzle velocity that does not exceed
- 6 700 feet per second.
- 7 Any individual desiring to participate in activities conducted by an
- 8 organization may be required to sign, or have a parent or legal guardian sign,
- 9 a liability waiver. The liability waiver shall be in such form as prescribed by
- 10 the chief administrative officer of the school and shall contain the
- appropriate language so as to relieve the school district, the school and all
- school personnel from liability for any claims arising out of the acts or
- omissions of any individual or any school personnel relating to activities
- 14 conducted by this organization.

## JDDB Reporting to Law Enforcement (See EBC and JDD)

**JDDB** 

1 Unless reporting would violate the terms of any memorandum of understanding

2 between the district and local law enforcement, wWhenever a student engages in

3 conduct which constitutes the commission of any misdemeanor or felony at school, on

4 school property, or at a school supervised activity and/or has been found 1) in

5 possession of a weapon, 2) in possession of a controlled substance or illegal drug, or

6 3) to have engaged in behavior at school which has resulted in or was substantially

7 likely to have resulted in serious bodily injury to others, the principal shall report

8 such act to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
