Personalized Plan of Study Pathways

- Intro level courses for pathways in grades 9 10
- Limited or no pre-requisites for intro and technical level courses
- Application level courses require at least 1.0 credit in the pathway
- Students can change pathways at any time, but must enroll in 7.0 credits each semester
- Students who desire a reduced schedule must have parent, counselor and principal permission

Personalized Plan of Study Proposal

- Allow students to replace Civics 9 with a pathway intro course.
- Allow student to reduce schedule in grade 10, 11 and/or 12 if:
 - The student has passed all courses in the previous year,
 - The student is on track to graduate,
 - The student has a plan of study that reflects a pathway and has chosen courses for the upcoming year that reflect that plan of study,
 - The student has written permission from the parent, principal and counselor.

Proposal

- District and building administration will continue to make determination to offer courses based on:

 - Enrollment requests at each school
 - Staffing, licensure and teacher qualifications
 - Facilities, equipment and supplies
 - Programmatic balance

Credit Recovery & Acquisition

Current Practice

- Students are allowed to take courses for course recovery after they have failed to earn the credit. There is no cost for credit recovery.
- Students are limited to 7 hours per day
- A limited number of students take courses through post-secondary partners or the Lawrence Virtual School (LVS) for credit at Lawrence or Free State High School
- Extra course fee is \$150 per course through LVS.

Credit Recovery & Acquisition

Proposal

- "Brick and mortar" students would have access to courses through the Lawrence Virtual School for credit
- Students would have access to online course work through post-secondary partners for high school credit
- Students would have access to online courses through their high school
- Students could take more than 7 hours or earn summer credits. Cost would be \$150 per semester course (.5 credit)
