District Earns \$100,000 Grant

A nearly \$100,000 USDA/Kansas Department of Agriculture Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure Program Grant will support the creation of a district-supporting bakery at Community Connections at Pinckney. The bakery will engage with the local food system by prioritizing the utilization of local grains through expanded Farm-to-School partnerships and enhanced recipes and meals provided by our child nutrition programs. The bakery will also offer job training for students with disabilities attending our transition programs at Pinckney.
