PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

College and Career Readiness at Langston

One of our building goals is to help prepare students for college. At the elementary level the readiness skills we focus on are executive functioning skills. Classroom teachers in grades 2-5 introduce one skill a month and provide coaching and practice with that skill. The focus skill for March is **Metacognition.** Metacognition allows a person to size up a problem situation, take into account multiple pieces of information, and make good decisions about how to proceed. This skill looks different depending on the age of the student.

CONTENTS

Primary Students

- Can adjust behavior in response to feedback from a teacher
- Can watch what happens to others and change behavior appropriately
- Can verbalize more than one solution to a problem and make the best choice

Intermediate Students

- Can anticipate the result of a course of action and make adjustments accordingly (e.g. to avoid getting in trouble)
- Can articulate several solutions to problems and explain the best one
- Enjoys the problem-solving component of school assignments or video games

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These competencies are essential to a child's growth and learning ability. Students begin skill development in these area during their preschool years and should continue to progress through adulthood. Executive functioning skills have been a great addition to our Langston curriculum.
